Dear Mr. Patel and Mr. Schumacher:

The Committee on the Judiciary is conducting oversight of the adequacy and enforcement of U.S. antitrust laws. ¹ Unilever's position on the Global Alliance for Responsible Media (GARM) Steer Team places Unilever at the center of collusive behavior that could potentially violate U.S. antitrust law. To inform potential legislative remedies such as whether existing civil and criminal penalties and current antitrust enforcement efforts are sufficient to deter anticompetitive collusion in the advertising industry, the Committee must first understand the nature of this activity.

The Committee has obtained documents that show Unilever is closely involved in GARM's efforts to boycott, demonetize, and censor disfavored viewpoints.² In particular, Unilever appears to further GARM's collusive behavior through Unilever's leadership on the GARM Steer Team, a self-described 'board of directors' that plot the direction of GARM.³ As President of Unilever USA, Mr. Patel is uniquely positioned to advance the Committee's oversight and legislative reforms by explaining Unilever's decision to participate in GARM.

As the Committee discussed with your counsel, we write to respectfully request Mr. Patel's testimony at a hearing before the Committee on the Judiciary titled, "Collusion in the

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Global Alliance for Responsible Media," on July 10, 2024, at 10:00 a.m. in room 2141 of the Rayburn House Office Building. - (5)(A) Each committee shall, to the greatest extent practicable, require witnesses who appear before it to submit in advance written statements of proposed testimony and to limit their initial presentations to the committee to brief summaries thereof.
- (B) In the case of a witness appearing in a non-governmental capacity, a written statement of proposed testimony shall include—(i) a curriculum vitae; (ii) a disclosure of any Federal grants or contracts, or contracts, or payments originating with a foreign government, received during the past 36 months by the witness or by an entity represented by the witness and related to the subject matter of the hearing; and (iii) a disclosure of whether the witness is a fiduciary (including, but not limited to, a director, officer, advisor, or resident agent) of any organization or entity that has an interest in the subject matter of the hearing.
